Is for your children to be on mission at their school this year and to see Jesus use them to make an impact on many lives.

Mission Possible is a family resource designed to help your children have a gospel lens to view their school and their presence in it. This resource empowers children to view their schools as mission fields full of opportunities to make a lasting impact. To the right are 12 "missions," and we encourage your kids to pick at least 8, to accomplish over the first month of school.

Parents, we encourage you to help your children in the process of picking and executing each mission. Encourage them, pray with them, ask them how it is going, and celebrate with them as they accomplish their missions.

We pray that this school year will leave a lasting mark on your child's life as they see and realize that God can use them right now for His Kingdom. With God, nothing is impossible, and He can do immeasurably more than we can ask, think, or imagine, so let's pray, ask, and believe that He will do it in our children's lives!

Pray each night as a family for one of your teachers and a student

Slip notes of encouragement,
Bible verses, or prayers into other students lockers

Ask a teacher if they
have a specific prayer
request you can
commit to praying for
everyday that week

Leave an encouraging note for one of your teachers

Make a card or special treat for your school janitor, bus driver, or cafeteria workers Volunteer to help a
classmate with their
schoolwork, if they are
struggling with a subject
that you are good at or
studying for a test
